

Intellectual Disability / IQ / Giftedness



Intellectual Disability effects many children and varies in its presentation. Diagnostic Assessment will allow a Clinical Diagnosis to better understand the needs of your child.

Assessment Measures

- **The Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children – 5th Edition (WISC V)**
The WISC-V is used to measure the general thinking and reasoning skills of children aged 6 to 16 years. This assessment provides a composite score that represents a child's overall intellectual ability (FSIQ), as well as primary index scores that measure the following areas of cognitive functioning: verbal comprehension, visual spatial processing, fluid reasoning, working memory, and processing speed.
- **Adaptive Behaviour Assessment System – 3rd Edition (ABAS III)**
The ABAS-III is a multidimensional and standardised assessment tool used to assess the functional skills necessary for daily living of individuals between 0 to 89 years of age. It offers a multi-informant assessment of children and youth across multiple settings, with rating forms for parents and teachers. This measure assesses 11 essential skill areas within 3 major adaptive domains: Conceptual, Social, and Practical, facilitating the identification of strengths and weaknesses. The ABAS-III is electronically administered.
- **Specific Tools**
A range of other specific assessment tools selected according to the individual needs of the client.
